



NEED HOUSING ASSISTANCE?

The DCAid tool is a quick and simple process that allows people to find out if they are eligible for **housing assistance programs, utility assistance, homelessness prevention services**, and other programs that will help to improve their quality of life

The eligibility screening process is a series of questions that takes approximately 1-2 minutes to complete.

Users can find out if they are eligible for DCA services that provide assistance with rent, including the Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher Program and the State Rental Assistance Program, **heating costs, utility bills**, removal of lead hazards in the home, Veterans Affairs Supportive Housing (VASH), weatherization assistance, and homelessness prevention programs. The results, based on general income and household information entered, will provide the user with a brief description of eligible programs with contact information for the agency where the user can apply.





Family Outreach Program (FOP)

FOP aims to stabilize Morris County families by fostering the family's strengths and enabling youth to remain at home and in school. Services will be provided in the home and in the community. The length of services averages 3-6 months, meeting anything from 1-2 hours per week with bilingual staff for English/Spanish speaking families.

**Services available through telehealth platforms
(video or phone appointments)**

This Service is Open to:

- Families with children between the ages of 0-18 years of age
- Families whose children may be at risk for out-of-home placement
- Families who have experienced traumatic situations



This Service Provides:

- Communication and advocacy skills for the family
- Community connections for basic needs
- Group counseling to strengthen family relationships
- Budgeting for all family members
- Parent coaching and skill building
- Assistance with managing school concerns
- Stress reduction
- 24-hour/7-day a week on call crisis intervention

Family Outreach Program (FOP)

FOP tiene como objetivo estabilizar a las familias del condado de Morris capitalizando en las fortalezas de la familia y ayudando a que los menores permanezcan en casa y en la escuela. Los servicios serán provistos en el hogar y en la comunidad y duran un promedio de 3 a 6 meses, y cubren 1 a 2 horas por semana con un trabajador bilingüe.

Registration Information:

We are thankful to have been able to offer an expanded Food Distribution service for the local Elizabeth community during the pandemic. We are profoundly grateful to the many individual volunteers and donors, civic groups, and corporate entities that have allowed us to be here for you and the many families who have benefited from our food offerings.

As we plan for the future needs of the community, we ask those who wish and need to continue receiving food assistance from to register with our Food Pantry. This will allow us to comply with the requirements of the Community Food Bank of NJ, a major source of food provisions for our Pantry, as well as helps us gauge what services might be of benefit to you and your family. Importantly, please know that going forward our regular food distributions will be prioritized to those who are currently registered.

If you anticipate requiring food assistance from St. Joseph's for the next month and perhaps beyond we are asking that you contact our Case Managers by telephone beginning this week to Register (contact information below) if you have: (1) either never Registered; or (2) if your Registration has not been renewed in the last 18 months. When calling to Register you will be asked to provide basic information about your family makeup and financial resources. We can assure you that no private information about you will be shared with any state or federal law enforcement authorities.

Our Case Managers will be available to take your calls to begin Registration, or to answer any questions you may have, between the hours of 9:00 and 4:00 on Monday, Tuesdays, and Thursdays. For English speaking clients please call Case Manager Pat D'Anna at (732) 340-6060, and for Spanish speaking clients please call Case Manager Peg Tursi at (732) 343-1434. We will do our best to accommodate other language speaking clients as necessary. (No in-office Registrations are taking place at this time due to social distancing requirements). When you call to Register please have the following information ready:

- (1) **RESIDENCY:** Proof of your Elizabeth NJ residency, which may be shown by any of the following: a current ID, lease, utility bill, or school record. Other available proof of residency are also acceptable.
- (2) **INCOME:** Family income information, including whether your family receives government assistance such as Supplemental Security Income or Food Stamps is requested. Income eligibility is based on Federal Poverty Level guidelines.
- (3) **FAMILY MEMBERS:** Names and dates of births of family members in the home are also requested. Please note that only one family member may Register for their family.

We look forward to continuing to serve you and the Elizabeth community.

Al llamar para registrarse, se le pedirá que proporcione información básica sobre cuántos hay en su familia y los recursos financieros. Podemos asegurarle que ninguna información privada sobre usted será compartida con ninguna autoridad policial estatal o federal.

Nuestros Administradores de Casos estarán disponibles para tomar sus llamadas para comenzar el Registro, o para responder a cualquier pregunta que pueda tener, entre las 9:00 y las 4:00 los lunes, martes y jueves. Para clientes de habla inglés, llame al Administrador de Casos Pat D'Anna al (732) 340-6060, y para los clientes de habla hispana, llame al Administrador de Casos Peg Tursi al (732) 343-1434. Haremos todo lo posible para dar cabida a otros clientes que hablan otros idiomas según sea necesario. (No se están realizando registros en la oficina en este momento debido a los requisitos de distanciamiento social). Cuando llame para registrarse, tenga lista la siguiente información:

- (1) **RESIDENCIA:** Prueba de su residencia en Elizabeth NJ, que puede ser demostrada por cualquiera de los siguientes: una identificación actual, contrato de arrendamiento, factura de servicios públicos o registro escolar. Otras pruebas disponibles de residencia también son aceptables.

- have no documentation from the U.S Citizen and Immigration Service; or
- Are non-immigrant (students, temporary workers, or children of a worker or visitor on business; or
- Are a qualified alien who is subject to the 5-year bar* on Medicaid, such as lawful permanent residents, aliens granted parole for a least one year, and certain victims of domestic violence. (this 5-year bar does not apply to children and pregnant women)
